




### Principal's Message





#### Language


Latin and French are the two languages offered to our students. In our language classes we do not study the grammar and vocabulary but we also try to learn about the culture of the people.

Nathan Watson and Bobby Allen, Co-Captains and the Riders beat every team in the league at least once, except for Baldwin. This was the only setback in our fine record.


This year, Mr. Mullen, our coach had fine players:

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


