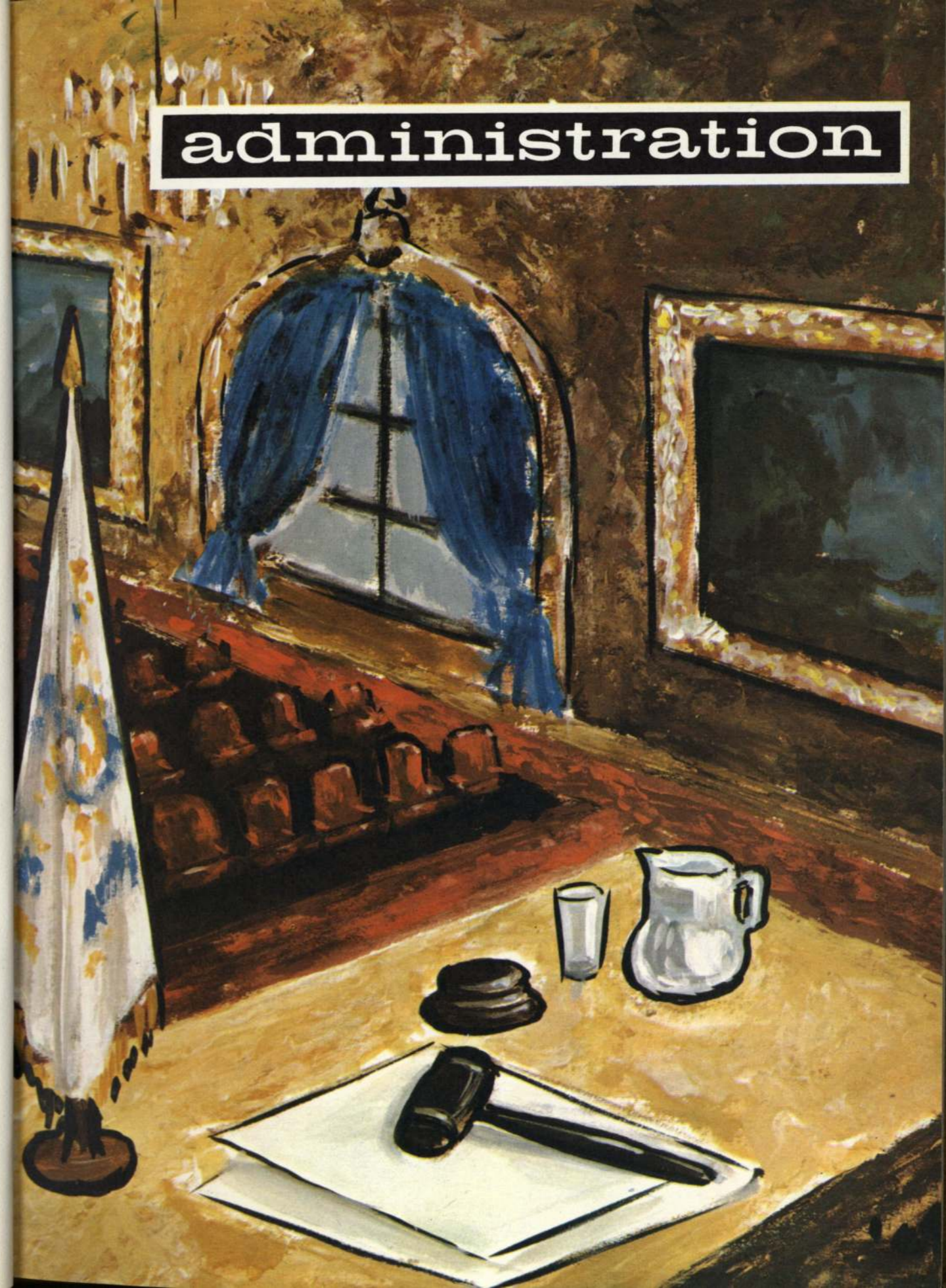
Principal's Message

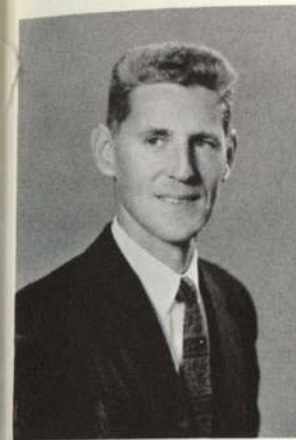
Homemaking

Library

The Library at Roosevelt Junior High School offers the students a variety of worthwhile, up-to-date books and magazines both for leisure reading and research.

Included are the classics, the easy-to-read, and technical books for the more advanced students; also pamphlets, a picture and vocational file.

In the selection of books for the library, the needs and interests of the students are carefully considered, built around the curriculum of the school and the various departments.

The librarian and his staff attempt to make the library an interesting place in which to study or browse. Books and other materials have been arranged to be easily available for the students.

There are now 6,500 volumes in our library, a record few school libraries can match. Circulation averages 75 books a day.

This year, Mr. Mullen, our coach had fine players:

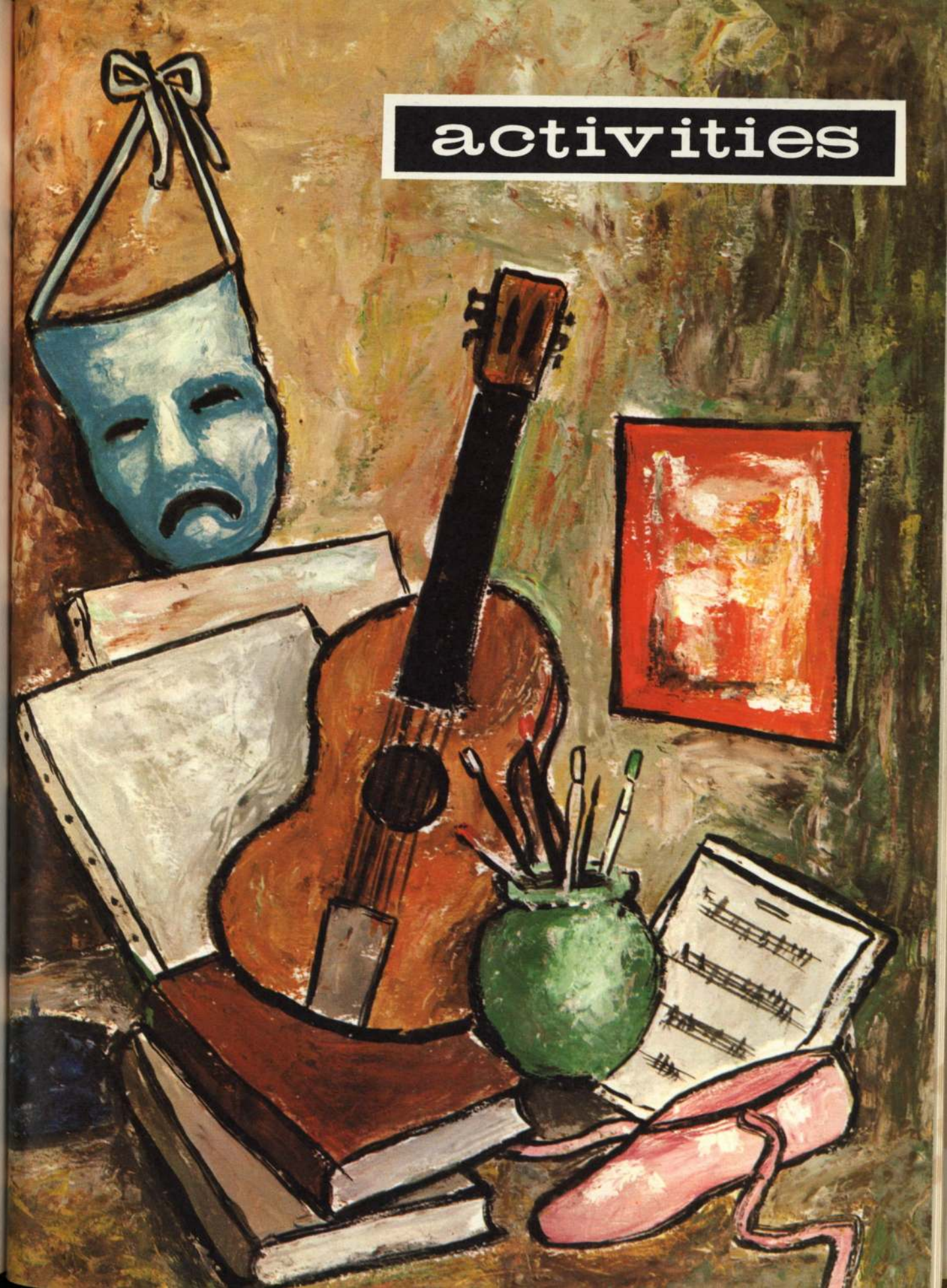

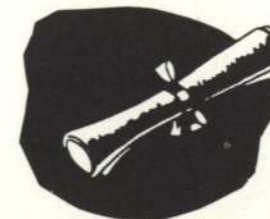

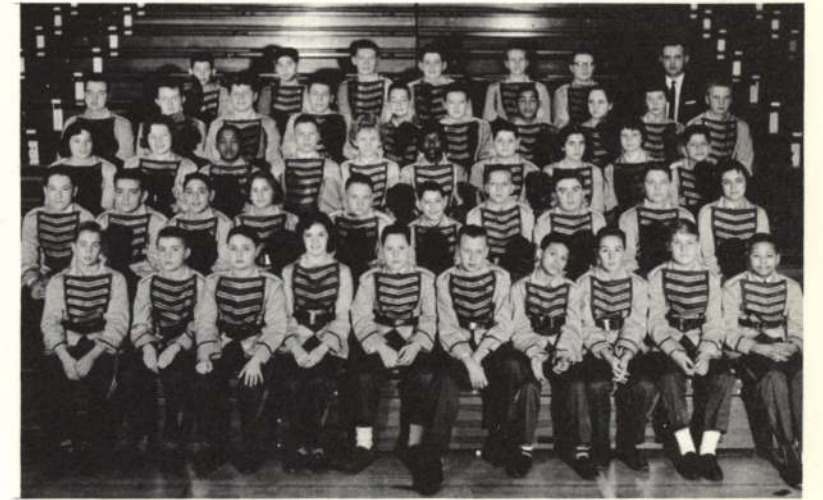
